



PATH Transportation Assistance Fund Eligibility Checklist

- Is the person a resident of the city of Charlottesville or Albemarle, Fluvanna, Greene, Louisa, or Nelson County? (must live in Region Ten to receive assistance)
- Is the individual 60+ years old or a person with a disability?
- Can the request be fulfilled using public transportation, Jaunt, or a volunteer driver?
- Does the individual have insurance that covers transportation costs? Some Medicare plans and most Medicaid plans have coverage for some transportation costs. We can call to check on the client's behalf if they would like us to.
- Can the appointment be rescheduled to a time when transportation is available? (This could be through Jaunt, CAT, volunteer, family/friend, etc.).
- Is this a chronic or ongoing need? (This program is meant for occasional use. Chronic needs should be addressed through other means if possible).
- Has the person received assistance from the TAF before? (If they have received assistance previously, the PATH team will review the request and make a decision. A person may receive assistance more than once, but it is meant to be a last resort and is not for chronic needs).
